I received this mail from Pastor Justus Ochuro and wanted to share his report with you.

Brother James,
Last Week I was in Taveta, Kenya on Church planting mission. We finished the meetings and left Taveta Wednesday evening. I didn't know exactly where we were going but Pastor Erick, one of our students did.

The next morning I found myself at the foot of Mt. Kilimanjaro in Tanzania after a two and a half hour drive through the Tsavo National Park. We ministered to the church there.

The following day we set off for another really remote place called Njoro Simba (a place where Lions gather for Water). Although there was no road to the place better than a path for elephants and people, a pastor with us was willing to take us in his vehicles. We took two vehicles but one did not make it because the path was so bad. They told me "Oh it is not very far. It will take just few minutes to get there." It took us three more hours to get there. When we arrived, all I saw was this church building.



Even though I did not see any houses from the church building because of the brush and trees, people were waiting for us to arrive. Then more people came from their homes. We preached the Gospel to them, dedicated their children to the Lord and ministered to each person as the Lord directed us.



How would you like these log benches if the service lasted for the three to four hours we ministered? They are just logs and have been put there permanently.
